She specializes in philosophy of religion and in the encounter between philosophy of religion, philosophy of language and ethics. She is the author of *Divinely Abused: A Philosophical Perspective on Job and his Kin* (London and New York, Continuum, 2010), a co-editor of *Forgiveness: Probing the Boundaries* (Oxford: Inter Disciplinary Press, 2010), and the author of numerous articles that explore the nature of faith, doubt and their relation to one another, evil, suffering and various conceptions of their defeat. She is currently working on a manuscript in which she comparatively explores the concept of divine providence in Maimonides and Kierkegaard.
